




Healthcare for every BODY!

Healthcare & Education Partnership



She leads our Maasai medical delivery team, working alongside our volunteer RNs. In addition, she conducts Maasai community classes on HIV Prevention, Family Planning, and the Risks of Female Genital Cutting.

Patients in Selela ranged widely in age, from 2 months to 99 years, presenting a diverse array of medical needs often compounded by nutritional deficiencies.



Preventing waterborne gastrointestinal and urinary infections is a critical community health priority. We collaborate with local healthcare leaders, such as Andrew, a lab technician at Selela Dispensary, to provide ongoing education on microbiological water testing and treatment.
